NEW COVID – 19 Booster- If you are on treatment for an autoimmune disease, with the exception of Rituxan, which has special recommendations to discuss with your physician, we recommend that you get the NEW COVID-19 Booster shot. The booster should be administered NO SOONER than 6 Months after your second original COVID-19 shot. If you are on Methotrexate, take the COVID-19 Booster 1 week after last dose of Methotrexate and then resume Methotrexate 1 week after receiving the Booster shot.

FLU Vaccine - The CDC recommends everyone 6 months or older get a flu vaccine each year, as long as they do not have certain symptoms or conditions.

Those who should consult a medical professional about flu vaccines may be immunocompromised, have a history of severe allergic reaction to any component of the vaccine, children between 2-4 who have received a diagnosis of asthma or people who are pregnant.

RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) Vaccine – The respiratory syncytial virus is a "common respiratory virus that usually causes mild, cold-like symptoms," according to the CDC. Infants and adults 60 and older are most at risk for severe outcomes from RSV and should receive the vaccine.
